Several years have passed since "Miss Natalie" (as she is affectionately known) first came to public attention - now frail (after fourteen years living on the streets), she still retains her passion for music and has become an icon while playing around the streets of Melbourne.

The documentary will briefly cover her real life story but will mainly focus on her amazing music talent, and her original music compositions, rather than the tragedies that have taken place in her life - behind the scenes sequences from the making of the RED ROSES MUSICAL will also be included in the documentary.
